The Journey to 1:1 at the Elementary Level

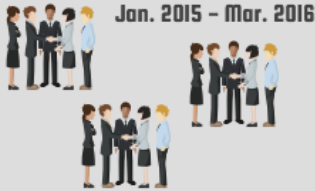
Technology is an Event

Student travel to computer labs 1x per week to learn basic computing skills and complete digital projects.

The Ed Tech Revolution

New digital learning tools allow the teacher to use technology in the classroom to enhance his or her lesson.

LCSS elementary schools decide to pilot the use of iPads 1-2 times per week in all classrooms.

Next Generation Learning Design

Teams of teachers, administrators and learning design staff meet to discuss the benefits of technology and the needs of the 21st century learner.

- The following recommendations emerge:
 - Pilot 1:1 iPads in select classrooms
 - Supplement the curriculum with interactive digital resources
 - Upgrade aging projectors with new interactive touch screen boards.

Technology Support

LCSS adds additional learning design and technology support at the elementary level.

Technology coaches assist teachers with the creation of technology enhanced lessons to complement their already robust academic curriculum.

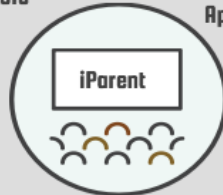
Digital Classrooms

Teachers begin to supplement their curriculum with digital resources and discover innovative ways to use iPads to increase student engagement during lessons.

Principals - after observing the benefits of technology enhanced lessons - begin to request additional support for the less tech savvy teachers and extra sets of iPads for their schools.

1:1 Pilot begins in 6 Classrooms

Two teachers from each school are selected to pilot 1:1 devices. Each teacher is given the following:

- One classroom set of iPads
- Teacher selected learning platforms to supplement their curriculum with high quality digital resources.
- Weekly training and support to create a digitally enhanced 21st century classroom.

iParent University

The Learning Design and Technology Team in collaboration with school principals and teachers will host 3 iParent University to educate parents and gather important feedback on the following topics:

- Internet safety and content filtering
- Screen time
- Take home policies

The next iParent Night is Tuesday, April 19th.

A Focus on Outcomes

Learning Design team members, principals and teachers evaluate the outcomes of the 1:1 pilot on the development of the whole child.

In May, this team of educators will make recommendations to the LCSS Board of Directors regarding the implementation of the 1:1 initiative in the fall of 2016.
