KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Kindergarten packets will be accepted beginning on **Kindergarten Registration Day, Friday, February 17, 2017, 8 am – 1 pm** and thereafter. During a Pre-Registration time period, priority will be given to:

1. Siblings of current LCSS students and alumni, and children of LCSS employees.
2. St. Lawrence and St. Mary Preschool families.

The following priority placement will then be considered for all other applications received at Kindergarten Registration.

3. Children of registered families from the six Tippecanoe County parishes.
4. Children of registered families in parishes within the Diocese of Lafayette.
5. Children of registered families in parishes outside the Diocese of Lafayette.
6. All other students are welcome.

After Kindergarten Registration, applications will be admitted first come, first served.

A student entering Kindergarten should be at least five years of age on or before August 1. Enrollment of students not five years old by August 1 is strongly discouraged. Not being five years old can also make a child not eligible for various Student Aid programs, such as the SGO Grant and the Indiana School Choice Scholarship.

A child who is four years-old prior to September 30, may be evaluated by the School Principal one month prior to the school start to determine their readiness. Admission will be approved only if the student is determined to possess the readiness skills necessary to be successful in kindergarten.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION AFTER FEBRUARY 17, 2017:

1. Submit the following to LCSS Admissions Director

- Application form**
- Registration fee** payable to the LCSS - \$50 per child (The application fee is non-refundable unless a student is denied admission due to the LCSS being unable to meet the student's special education accommodations. The application fee is credited toward the student's tuition.)
- Parish Verification & Assistance Form – (one per family)** Parish membership qualifies you for the Tier 1 Tuition rate. If you are registered at a Tippecanoe county parish, this form also serves as application for Parish Assistance. Complete and return with your application packet – the Admissions Office will submit to your pastor. If you are a Catholic family moving to the Lafayette area, submit it the completed form with your application. Once you choose a parish and register with their parish office, the Admissions office will secure the Pastor's signature. Non-Catholic and International students do not need to complete.
- Copy of legal Birth Certificate**
- Baptismal Certificate** (provide copy if Catholic and not a member of a Tippecanoe County Parish)
- Health and Immunization Records** – Or submit updated records to school office within two weeks of the first day of school.)
