In order to foster a complete and open collaboration in this endeavor, as parents, guardians, students, teachers, coaches, administrators, volunteers, and the entire school community, we pledge to uphold, honor and promote the Mission of the Lafayette Catholic School System.

Application Process for International Students applying to Grades 1 - 6



All International students are to physically reside with their parents or a designated guardian over twenty-one (21) years of age. It is the responsibility of the student to find their own guardian or host family.

Application Steps

1. Submit an Application Packet to the LCSS Admissions Director after January 1

A completed application packet will include:

- The **LCSS Elementary International Application**
- A **Copy of the Student's Passport**
- Academic Records** from the student's current school and grades from at least the previous school year translated into English.
- \$100 non-refundable application fee** payable to the LCSS (The application fee is credited toward the student's tuition.)

2. School Principal Reviews Application Packet for Acceptance

All new applicants must be approved by the school Principal and will be admitted conditionally for one semester. *Approved international students will be placed after all other approved applicants received by April 15 have been placed.*

3. Complete Enrollment

- Provide the school with the following (translated into English):
 - o a **list of Immunizations**,
 - o a **copy of your notarized Guardianship papers**, and
 - o **proof of health insurance coverage** while residing in the US.

Requirements to Issue an I-20

The Lafayette Catholic School System charges a \$100 fee to issue an I-20. The DSO may issue an I-20 for an International student approved for admission by the school Principal when the following requirements have been met. Variation from this policy is at the discretion of the DSO.

- One semester of tuition** must be paid in advance. (This tuition is non-refundable unless official Consulate documentation is received stating the student was denied their F1 Visa.)
- Statement from the family's bank of sufficient funds** calculated in U.S. dollars for one year's tuition and living expenses in the United States, or a letter from the Student's Exchange program stating how the student's tuition and living expenses are being met.
- If the student will NOT be living with his/her parent, Guardianship papers** translated into English stating the parent(s) give custody to the named guardian(s) while the student is attending the LCSS. Every student of the LCSS must reside with their guardian regardless of the LCSS student's age. The guardian must be at least twenty-one (21) years of age. The guardianship papers must also state the student will be physically residing with guardian, and must be signed by custodial parent(s) and notarized.
