How long will LCSS be closed?

On Thursday, March 19, Governor Eric Holcomb **mandated all schools to close until May 1, 2020**. LCSS will follow all directives from our local, state and national leaders in the effort to slow the spread of COVID-19.

What is the eLearning schedule for students?

LCSS will hold eLearning for students on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from March 31st through May 1st. Mondays and Fridays of eLearning weeks are considered Emergency Closure days and will not need to be made up. Faculty and staff will use Monday and Friday to prepare for E-Learning.

Frequently Asked Questions

How will I receive communication and updates from LCSS Schools?

Any school closures or other emergency information will be communicated using our standard channels of communication, including emails, [EventLink](#), and the [LCSS website](#). Parents, guardians, and staff who believe they are not receiving critical information should email updated contact information to helpdesk@lcss.org.

Will the schools be open for regular business during this closure?

In an effort to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, school offices will not be open to the public while schools are closed. If you need to reach a staff member, please email them directly. Emails are located on the staff pages for each school. If you are in need of help with enrollment, student transfer or other matters, email admissions@lcss.org.

What if my student needs a work permit?

The Indiana Department of Labor has suspended two requirements of Indiana's child labor law:

- For employers to have on file a work permit for minors they employ;
- Permission letters from the school allowing minors to work during restricted hours of 7:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. on eLearning days. This action only applies to 16- and 17-year-old students. Those who are 14- and 15-years-old fall under the federal school hours restriction.

This directive will be in effect until May 1, 2020. If you have further questions, email helpdesk@lcss.org and we will route your question to the appropriate person.

What if my student doesn't have home Wi-Fi access?

Will spring athletics and/or extracurricular activities continue while schools are closed?

All athletics and extracurricular activities held at school facilities are canceled until May 3.

Will there be a high school graduation? If not, how will students receive their diploma?

At this time, commencement **has not** been canceled or rescheduled. We will follow the guidance of local, state and federal health officials.
